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1. INFERENCE:

- Question) What can you (infer / learn / tell / message)?
 - use IQ
- Answer)
 - i can (___) that (answer Q)
 - source states that ___ (evidence)
 - implies that ___ (explain)

2. INFERENCE WITH PURPOSE:

- Question) Why did (author) publish / issue this / make this statement?
- Answer)
 - author - reason format for message-purpose (start with author > why - related to IQ)
 - expected outcome (to change mindset / behaviour / convince)
 - 1) purpose = wants (audience) to (intended action)
 - 2) source ___ shows that (evidence)
 - 3) this implies that ___ (explain)

3. SIMILARITY / DIFFERENCE:

- Question) asking for...
 - both = how similar/different are source a/b (to what extent / how far does...)
 - only similar = how are source a/b similar (in what ways... support...)
 - only difference = how source a/b differ (in what ways... different...)
- Answer)
 - para 1 - similar in content (peel > mention both sources + evidence > explanation)
 - para 2 - different in content (peel > mention both sources + evidence > explanation)
 - para 3 - similar/different in point of view/tone/purpose
 - tone - optimistic / pessimistic
 - views - support / does not
 - purpose - agree / disagree

4. Question 4 - RELIABILITY / EFFECTIVENESS:

- choose either reliable / unreliable (only 1) + higher level
- Reliable
 - evidence in own source (answer Q)
 - supported by another source (cross reference with another source that has the same message)
 - source B is reliable as evidence on (Q) is supported by source A on the (Q)
 - source B states that "___" > implies that [XXX] > therefore
 - source A also claims that [XXX] > states "___" > therefore source B is reliable that (Q)
- Unreliable
 - evidence in own source (answer Q)
 - contradicted by another source (cross reference with another source that has the different message)
 - source B states that "___" > implies that [XXX]

- however, source A states that [opposite XXX] > evidence > therefore unreliable
- Higher Level:
 - (quote source > mention author + audience + intention)
 - due to tone / bias
 - tone: only highlights 1 factor / emotional view (use harsh words to stir emotions / exaggeration)
 - biased: evidence made by opposition (Eg. convince SGs that government XX - sway SGs opinion = change supporting sides)

- Question) no source (choose any 4 sources in the paper)
- Answer)
 - 2 agree
 - 2 disagree
 - source A shows that (QUESTION) > source A states that "___" > this implies that... therefore I agree/disagree
 - X4 (x2 agree)(x2 disagree)
 - bonus - reliability (either agree / disagree)
 - eg. source P is government > biased > evidence + purpose of source

 - Different religion
