- 1 Fig. 1 shows the chain of links through the global economy.
 - (a) What do you understand by the term *production chain*?

- 2 Table 1 shows the Mortality Indices of Sydney, Australia, from 1901 to 1995-7.
 - (a) What is meant by the term *life expectancy*?

(b) As one of the largest Australian cities, how would Sydney's infant mortality rate differ from the rest of the country? [4]

Table 2 shows years of potential life lost through deaths before age 75 in 1995-7 for Sydney, Australia.

(c) Account for the trend in the causes of death as shown in Table 2.

- 3 Fig. 2A shows a model of a city dependent on public transport while Fig. 2B shows a model of a city dependent on private transport.
 - (a) Describe the effects transportation has on the spatial layout of a city as shown in Figs 2A and 2B. [4]
 - (b) Explain briefly one social problem traffic congestion can bring about in a city.

(c) Suggest two reasons why cities find it a challenge to encourage private transport users to switch to public transport. [6]

- 4 Fig. 3 shows the proportion of immigrants in Europe by region of origin in 2005.
 - (a) Describe the trends as shown on Fig. 3.

- (a) What roles do small-medium enterprises (SMEs) perform in the modern global economy and in turn how does globalisation affect them? [9]
- (b) Does the increasing globalisation of economic activities erode the role of the nation-state? [16]

OR

- (a) What factors help to explain the trends of offshoring and internationalisation of services? [9]
- (b) To what extent has the introduction of technology affected the nature of work both in the manufacturing and service sectors? [16]

Population Issues and Challenges

6 EITHER

Fig. 4 shows the projected date by which selected world areas will reach zero population growth.

- (a) Account for the different dates by which these regions will reach zero population growth. [9]
- (b) Discuss how proximate determinants of fertility have affected the demography of a country you have studied. [16]

OR

- (a) With reference to examples you have studied, show how countries have experienced population-resource disequilibrium. [9]
- (b) Assess the effectiveness of population policies that have been implemented to address the population-resource disequilibrium. [16]

- (a) Explain the co-existence of squatter settlements and gated communities in some urban areas. [9]
- (b) Show why urban regeneration is sometimes necessary. Evaluate the success of two strategies employed to achieve this purpose in one or more urban areas you have studied.

- (a) Should urban hierarchy be considered as fixed or as changing? Support your answer with examples. [9]
- (b) Describe the challenges of living in large cities and assess the responses to these challenges. [16]
