Outside / Inside sentences

The first sentence, which is the outside sentence, describes what appears to be. The second related sentence, which is the inside sentence, describes what the character is actually feeling or thinking. This gives the reader some additional insight into what is actually going on.

- He smiled and shook the man's hand as though nothing was wrong but on the inside, he was angrier than he had ever been.
- She appeared calm and composed but in actual fact, her heart was beating so fast and she felt breathless.
- The teacher sounded excited and full of energy. What her students did not know was how she exhausted she was, having stayed up the whole night just to prepare a good lesson.
- Toby said that he had forgiven Zack but it was far from the truth. He was secretly plotting revenge.

 - Exhausted yet curious about what lay ahead, they continued their journey ...
 - Graduating from secondary school life signaled the end of my carefree school days **but** it also heralded a new beginning.

Simple sentence: Technology has benefitted society.

Compound sentence: Technology has benefitted society but we have become over-reliant on it.

Complex sentence: Although technology has benefitted society, we have become over-reliant on it.
