

 - (a) With the use of data from Fig. 1A and 1B, identify if UK is a net importer or exporter of FDI in 2005.
 - **(b)** Describe the trends as observed in Fig. 1A and 1B. [4]
 - (c) (i) Compare and contrast the FDI inflow and outflow for Japan and China, giving evidences to support your answer. [4]
 - (ii) Account for the contrast in (c)(i). [3]

- 2 Table 1 shows the population structure of two countries.
 - (a) Define the term dependency ratio.
 - **(b)** Compare the population structures of the two countries in Table 1. [3]

- **3** Fig. 2 shows a model of the post-modern city.
 - (a) (i) Identify the areas labeled A, B, C, D using the following terms associated with urban structure: suburbs; an area of decentralised industry; CBD; a gentrified area. [3]
 - (ii) For any **one** of the areas you have identified in (a)(i), briefly explain the reasons for your choice of location. [3]
 - **(b)** Explain why planning authorities may choose to develop a flagship retail project at location Z and suggest the concerns that may arise. [6]

- **4** Fig. 3 shows the population of selected cities in 1950 and 2005, their projected population size in 2025 and change in the cities' world rank 1950 2025.
 - (a) Give the name of the city in Fig. 3 which is expected to have:
 - (i) the greatest increase in world rank; [1]
 - (ii) the least population growth after 1950. [1]
 - **(b)** Using Fig. 3, compare the growth of New York and São Paulo. [3]
 - (c) Outline some of the challenges associated with the continuing growth of cities in LDCs. [4]
 - (d) To what extent are population projections of limited value? [5]

- **(b)** Assess the role of supranational bodies in the economy of either a country or a regional grouping of countries. [16]

- (a) Explain the links between the Demographic Transition Theory and the age structure [9]
- (b) How far do you agree with the view that population growth will be too great for existing resources to sustain? [16]

6 OR

- (a) Describe and account for resource use variations between DCs and LDCs. [9]
- **(b)** Account for the trend of increasing feminisation of labour and discuss the resultant consequences. [16]

- (a) Explain the causes of inner city decline. [9]
- **(b)** Assess the range of public and private initiatives used in urban regeneration. [16]

7 OR

- (a) Explain some of the factors causing initial and subsequent growth of urbanisation. [9]
- **(b)** Evaluate different attempts to manage housing problems in one or more urban areas. [16]

Countries with the highest foreign direct investment (FDI) inflows in 2005




