Gardens by the Bay is now host to the world's longest sculpture, which serves as a call for visitors to do their parts to save wildlife. The 192m artwork, name *Love the Last March*, features 60 endangered animals cast in bronze and showcases both land and sea animals. Regional species such as orangutans and elephants also make an appearance. The two artists behind the creations feel that city people are too detached with wildlife. Public sculptures, to them, help to bring these animals back from an urban setting. It takes about three minutes to walk the length of the sculpture. Each sculpture have a QR code that brings visitors to a page of more information about the animal's diet, behaviour, and why the species was endangered. Visitors can also make donations to contribute to WWF Singapore's conservation efforts.

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
