Cluster 2 Fieldwork

1 Four Singapore students carried out an investigation on the needs of the elderly in the neighbourhood around their school. The hypothesis for their investigation was:

'Healthcare is the most important need for the elderly in the neighbourhood.'

Based on secondary research, the students found out that 50% of the elderly population in the neighbourhood were aged between 71-80 years.

The students conducted a survey with the elderly using a questionnaire. The survey was carried out at one site on a June afternoon. They surveyed 76 elderly people.

Resource 1 shows the questionnaire the students used for their survey. Resource 2 shows selected results of the survey. Resource 3 shows a comparison of the needs of two different elderly age groups.
