- 1) Candidates need to be aware of tenses. One of the worst droughts.
- 2) Candidates need to be aware of identifying adjectives and adjective phrases which are common in passages. In this case, **parched** lake, **snaking/snaky** cracks.
- 3) While many candidates were able to get this right, a handful of candidates were confused by the long sentence and forgot to check for SVA error. The subject of the sentence is "The parched lake bed".
- 4) Most of the candidates were able to get this right.
- 5) Many candidates answered this question wrongly. They identified 'posted' as the error. Again, students are reminded to be mindful of tenses. What is supposed to be posted online are the photos as written in the previous line.
- 6) Candidates are advised to familiarise themselves on the difference between the use of 'who' and 'whom'.
- 7) 8), 9), and 10) Most of the candidates were able to get this right.
