Cyclical Unemployment

- **→** Economic Slowdown
- → Fall in AD
- **→** Demand deficient economy
- → Fall in output
- → Decrease in demand for factors of production (Labour)
- **→** Increase in unemployment

Requirements: Examples and relating to Singapore context

Structural Unemployment

- → Changes in the business sectors
- → Current employment decreases the demand for labour
- → New employment opportunity demands for new skills from the labour force
- → Mismatch of the skills present in the labour and the skills demanded by the employers
- **→** Increase in Unemployment

Requirements: Examples and relating to Singapore context

Frictional Unemployment

- → Due to geographical immobility or imperfect information
- **→** Singapore (Imperfect Information)
- → Labours who are new to the workforce with imperfect information
- → Does not know where are the jobs available and what are skills required
- **→** Unemployment
