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

#### Text 2

The text below describes a boy, Ralph, being hunted. Read it carefully and answer Questions 5-12 in the spaces provided.

- Ralph lay in his cave, wondering about his wounds. The bruised flesh was inches in diameter over his right ribs, with a swollen and bloody scar where the flying spear had hit him. His hair was full of dirt and resembled the tendrils of a creeper. All over he was scratched and bruised from his flight through the forest. By the time his breathing was normal again, he had worked out that bathing these injuries would 5 have to wait. How could you listen for naked feet if you were splashing in water? How could you be safe by the little stream when even the leeches want a piece of you?
- Ralph listened. He was not far from Castle Rock, and during the first panic he had thought he heard sounds of pursuit. But the hunters had sneaked into the fringes of the greenery, and blended with the darkness under the leaves. Ralph closed his eyes and gave in to the demands of his aching body.
- The afternoon died away. At last Ralph wormed out of the ferns and sneaked forward to the edge of that impenetrable thicket that fronted the neck of land. He peered with elaborate caution between branches at the edge and saw a column of smoke rose thickly, so much so that Ralph wiped his mouth with the back of his hand and for the umpteenth time, Ralph felt the familiar growl in his body. A vision of a delectable charred bird appeared as he shook himself back to reality.
- Ralph saw that for the time being he was safe. He limped away through the fruit trees, came to a smashed acre of fruit, and ate greedily. When he had eaten he went 20 toward the beach. The best thing to do was to disregard this feeling of dread and rely on his gut. Realising that he could not stay here all night in the wilderness, Ralph's flesh crept and he shivered in the evening sun. No fire; no smoke; no rescue.
- The dying embers of the westering sun were lost among the branches. At length, he came to a clearing in the forest where rock prevented vegetation from growing. Now 25 it was a pool of shadows. Ralph nearly flung himself behind a tree when he saw

something standing in the center. But then he saw that the white face was bone and it grinned at him from the top of a stick. Ralph walked slowly into the middle of the clearing and looked steadily at it as it seemed to jeer at him cynically. Realising what it was, Ralph backed away immediately.

#### Text 3

The text below is about the problems of plastic waste. Read it carefully and answer Questions 13-19 in the spaces provided.

- A supermarket plastic bag serves its real purpose for 30 minutes, the duration of a journey in Singapore. In a drink, a straw is utilised for just 5 minutes. The use of a plastic stirrer is even more short-lived: all of 10 seconds. Yet, these items outlive us by a long margin 400 years, to be exact. Left in our environment, plastics affect ocean health and biodiversity. We know the problem does not simply end there.
- Do you know we are living with plastic in every way: eating, drinking and even breathing it? Around the world, microplastics have been found in the guts of fish, in tap water samples and even in air pollution. Little is being done to address this. There was a huge public disapproval when the four largest supermarkets in Singapore floated the idea of a plastic bag charge. The government welcomed the decision, hinting that incineration is not the solution. But we are missing the point: that Singapore's usage of plastic bags surpasses other countries and Singaporeans are evidently reliant on them. Stricter regulations from the government are required to reduce this stark difference. More than 40 countries have plastic bag bans or taxes in place, including China, Rwanda and Italy. Just across the Causeway, Johor is set to 15 ban plastic bags and polystyrene by this year. Last year, 39 governments agreed to reduce the amount of plastic going into the sea. By not taking action to reduce plastic's widespread use, we are continuing this global problem. It is high time for at mindset overhaul on plastic in Singapore.
- To solve this problem, the key lies in understanding what we should use less of, and 20 what we should eliminate. There are "useless" or unnecessary plastics those that A provide a few extra minutes of convenience but are disposed of after use. Most short- term plastic items like straws, lids, cups, and stirrers fall into this category. Refusing these useless plastics is an easy step to cut down on plastic use.
- On the other hand, there are plastics that are useful, though we can still reduce their 25 use. A case in point: plastic bags. Singapore's current usage of plastic bags borders on the excessive. Each person in Singapore is estimated to use about 13 plastic bags

a week. Alternatives like reusable bags are widely available in the market today. A recent study by the National Environment Agency has found that a reusable bag replaces the use of 125 single-use plastic bags in a year. A costlier charge on plastic 30 bags can be an effective way to reduce plastic use too.

5 Time is running out. Businesses need to be held accountable for used plastic, however useful its purpose. This includes being responsible for the entire life cycle of plastics, from packaging to recovery after use. On a national level, laws need to be put in place to effectively enable recycling by businesses and individuals. 35 Individuals should also play their part by using less plastic and supporting business and government measures that help address this issue. Everyone needs to step up and take action for a problem we will share with the next 16 generations.






