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TOUCH Community Services

Meals-on-Wheels programme provide meals for seniors who are home-bound and usually living alone.

- Volunteers help with meal preparations and deliveries for lunch and dinner.

Befriender programme provide art and craft activities and games for seniors at the centre.

- Volunteers plan and facilitate art and craft sessions as well as appropriate games for the elderly, while engaging centre facilitators about the needs of the elderly and the suitability of the activities.



The Salvation Army

Academic and Youth Mentoring programme provides coaching and activities for youth.

- Volunteers coach children and youth in their schoolwork, typically once a week over a 3-6 months commitment period as well as organise fun activities or outings for youth.

Fundraising activities for the underprivileged to help raise funds internally

- Volunteers raise funds or organise collection drives for pre-loved items. They may also involve their school or organisation to help raise funds internally by exercising their creativity and entrepreneurship skills for a good cause



Food from the Heart

The **Bread Run** programme aims to feed the needy with safe-for-consumption bread that would otherwise have been thrown away.

- Our bread runs are completed by our volunteers (Bread Runners), each of whom is assigned a route that comprises the pick-up of bread from our Bread Run partners and the drop-off of bread at our bread distribution points.

The **School Goodie Bag** programme focuses on providing underprivileged primary and secondary school students and their families with food rations.

- Volunteers raise funds in their schools or organisations for food purchase and operating costs such as logistical transportation and storage.
