Cluster 1: Sustainable Cities

- 1. Nairobi is the capital and largest city in Kenya located in East Africa. Resource 1 is a map that depicts the distribution of slums in Nairobi. Resource 2 is a photo of a slum dwelling in Kiberia, a neighbourhood in the city of Nairobi. Resource 3 is an article on creating public spaces for the low-income neighbourhoods in Nairobi.
- (a) With reference to Resource 1, describe the distribution of slums in Nairobi, Kenya. [4]
- (b) Describe the characteristics of slum dwelling in Kiberia, Nairobi, as shown in Resource [4] 2.
- (c) With reference to Resource 2 and your own knowledge, explain how the presence of [6] slums can lead to Nairobi's being unsustainable in its urban development.
- (d) Suggest some positive effects of slum dwellings. [4]
- (e) Using Resource 3, explain how creating public spaces can make the city of Nairobi's [6] low-income neighbourhoods more sustainable.



Cluster 1: Liveable Cities for the Elderly

2. Resource 4 shows the proportion of Tokyo's population by two main age groups – those aged 65 years or older and those aged 64 years or younger.

Resource 5 shows some challenges that Tokyo faced in ensuring the well-being of its elderly population.

Resource 6 are some photos of Sun City, a private retirement home for the elderly located in Yokohama, located just south of Tokyo.

- (a) Describe the changes in Tokyo's populations of the two age groups from 2000 to 2060 [4] as shown in Resource 4.
- (b) Account for the changes in Tokyo's population distribution from 2000 to 2060 shown in [4] Resource 4.
- (c) With reference to Resource 5, explain some challenges that Tokyo would face in [4] ensuring the well-being of its growing elderly population.
- (d) Referring to Resource 5 and your own knowledge, suggest what Tokyo can do to [4] ensure the well-being of its elderly.
- (e) With reference to Resource 6 and your own knowledge, suggest how Sun City in [7] Yokohama can impact the well-being of seniors living there.
