- 1 Taiwan is an economy in East Asia where rapid economic growth took place in the 1960s. Fig. 1 shows the exports from Taiwan (by percentage) in 1960 and 1997.
 - (a) Describe and account for the changes in the export of primary and secondary products. [4]
 - (b) With reference to any named country you have studied, examine the strategies of the government in promoting economic development. [8]

Population Issues and Challenges

- **2** Fig. 2a shows the population pyramids of Lesotho and Norway in 2000 while Fig. 2b shows the projected population pyramids of these two countries in 2025.
 - (a) Identify two differences between the dependent populations of Lesotho and Norway. [2]
 - (b) Compare the main changes in population structure between 2000 and 2025 for these two countries. [4]
 - (c) What will be the likely impacts of the demographic changes experienced by a country such as Norway? [6]

Urban Issues and Challenges

- **3** Fig. 3 shows the world's fastest growing cities in the period 1985-2000.
 - (a) Define the term *urbanisation*. [2]
 - (b) (i) Identify the general pattern between the locations of world's fastest growing cities and the level of urbanisation in the various parts of the world. Is there any exception?
 - (ii) Account for the trend you observed in (i). [3]
 - (c) Discuss the problems experienced by fast-growing cities. [5]

- (b) Using detailed examples, critically evaluate the consequences of overpopulation and underpopulation. [16]
